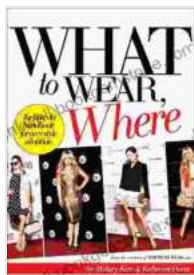

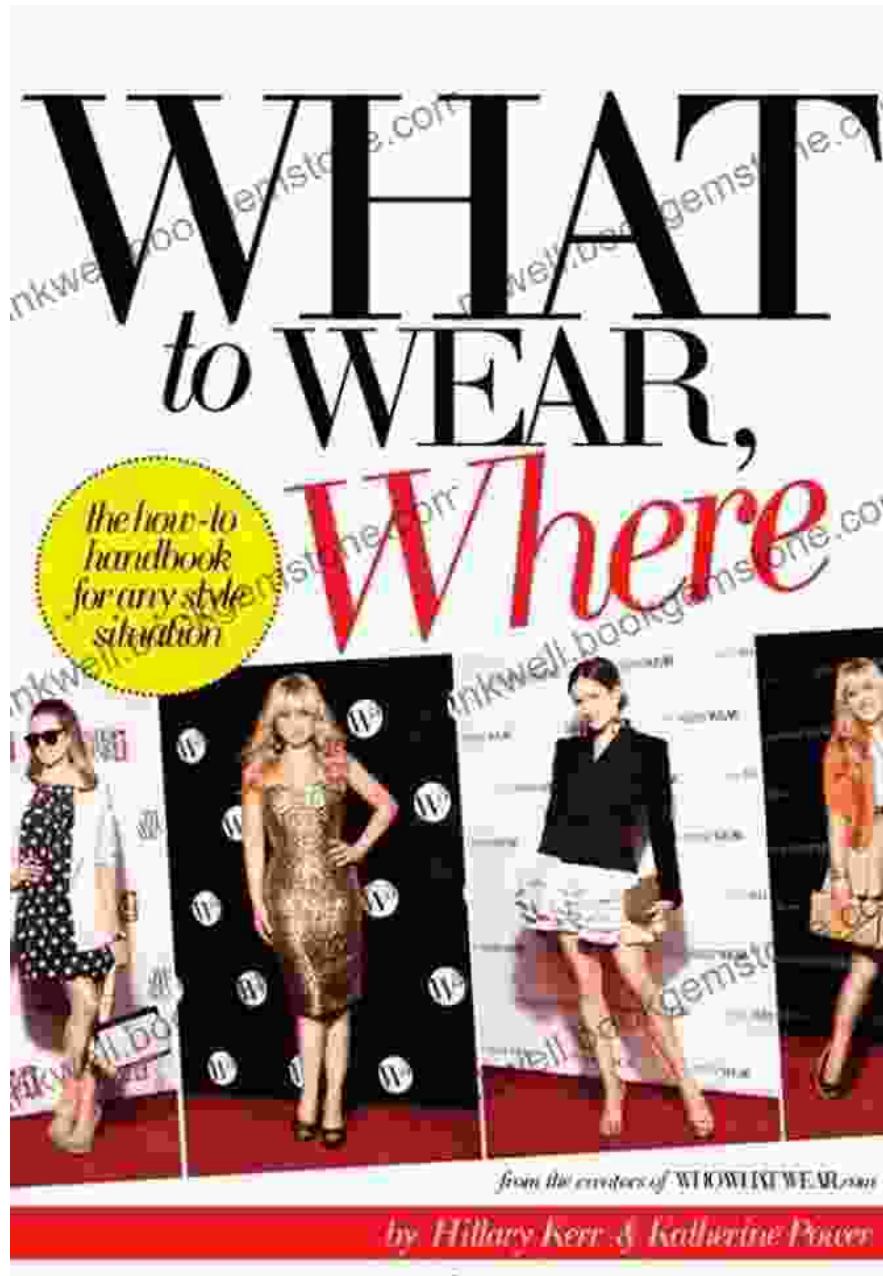

For Women: Suit or skirt with a blouse, dress shirt, dress pants, blazer, and pumps or flats



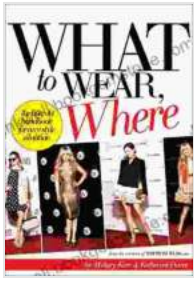
